



## MONTHLY FIRE CHIEFS REPORT

Regular Meeting: April 8, 2025

### Operations:

- We responded to 44 calls in March.
- Our Firefighter hiring process was very competitive, it was a difficult decision. Congratulations to Nathan Fowler, he joined Timberline in the spring of 2024 and will start employment on April 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Chief Schimanskey, Chief Hinderman, Jen Lomeli, the crew, and I attended a reunification training at the Gilpin Community Center on 3/28. The training was to determine a basic plan in the event the school is evacuated.
- The website continues to receive regular updates. The new host is working really well, is easy to use, and is not terribly time-consuming.

### Support Services:

- Engine 55 received a full service, and several outstanding items were repaired with minimal downtime and cost.
- The new deployment truck has been the focus, and I have approved some overtime to get it completed ASAP.
- Tender 54 is scheduled for its pre-sale pump test.
- The new tender is still on schedule for a July completion and delivery.

### Wildland/Mitigation:

- The Pinecliffe project was completed Monday except for hauling the chips, this will be completed when the Boulder County sort yard opens in May.
- Our Natural Disaster Mitigation grant was not chosen for funding. We will receive feedback and submit it again next round.
- 2025 chipping events will be: Aspen Springs in June, Severance Lodge in July, and Bun Gun Zhing Wak in August.
- Interview and hiring for the Spring/Summer season has gone very well. We had significant interest in the seasonal/temporary positions.
- We currently have 24 assessments scheduled, and private mitigation work is scheduled through May.
- Social media push for FREE assessments has gone well.

### Administration:

- We met with state historic people to determine their requirements for window replacement. They have provided us a guiding report. We plan on submitting for a small grant in October to assist with covering the costs of replacement.
- 2024 audit has been scheduled for June 16 and 17.
- The blood drive at Station 5 has been canceled. Vitalant had a large event the same day and could not accommodate both. We reached out to the Red Cross; they preferred a larger space than we had available. We will reschedule for Spring 2026 at Station 3.
- Many 2-hour meetings with KCI/Arête working through the drawings and plans for the Station 3 bay addition.
- We were awarded the DFPC Firefighter Safety and Disease Grant for ballistic helmets and vests in the amount of \$11,070.00.
- Timberline started collecting impact fees directly beginning on April 1, the transition has been smooth (so far).

### R&R:

- 7 new recruits completed the onboarding process and have started shifting.
- Two members attended EMR at Allenspark Fire.
- Five members are currently attending EMR at Coal Creek Fire.

- Two members are currently in FF1 in Boulder; this is at no cost to the district.
- RT130s (wildland recertifications) are underway.
- S130/190 (new wildland certifications) starts at the end of the month. Currently, 8 members are registered.
- The majority of the department has attended the mandatory Lucas training with GAA. The Lucas device is an automated CPR compression device.
- We currently have seven volunteer applications for the fall, one is in within the district.

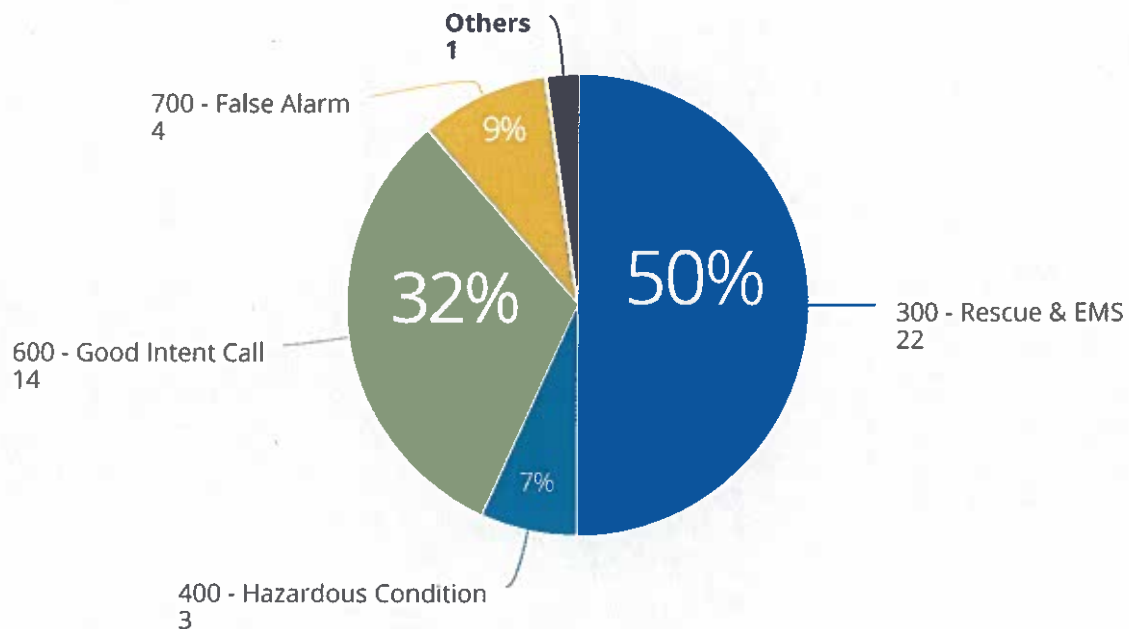

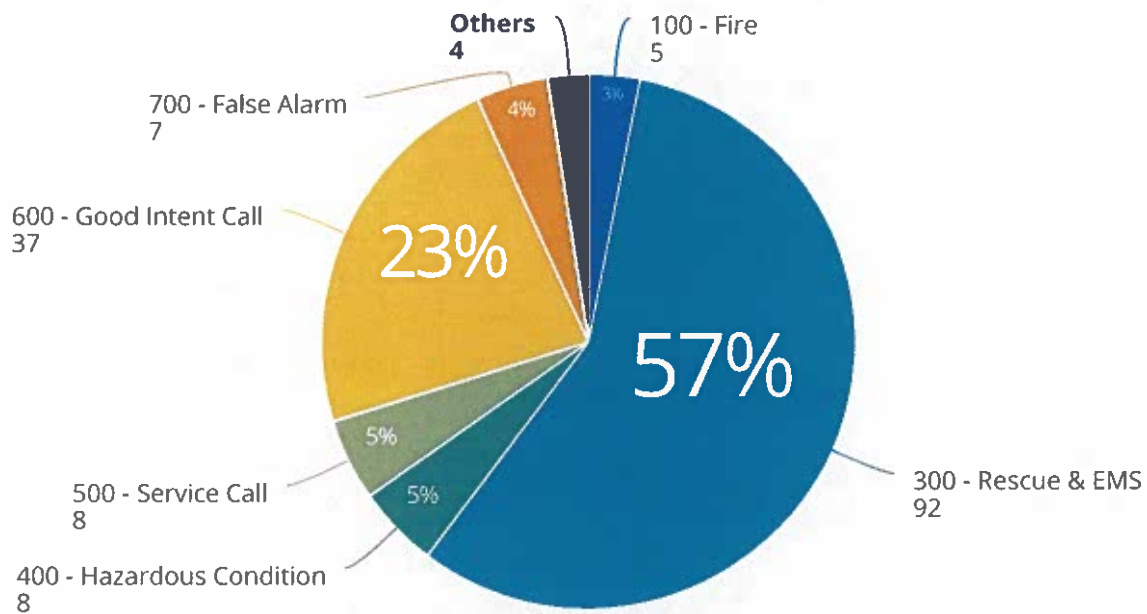
